Today's Game

The Hollywood Bears, Pacific Coast professional champions, endanger the fine record which they have made during the past season when they tangle with the star-studded Service All-Stars eleven at Gilmore Stadium this afternoon.

The Service All-Stars lineup is packed with some of the greatest gridiron names in the country—including Buddy Young, Elroy Hirsch, Paul Goverinali, "Wee Willie" Wilkin and Bob Dove, all of whom have gained All-America recognition.

The Hollywood Bears will take the field with the same squad which captured the Pacific Coast professional title this year. It is an aggregation which is as strong as any football team in the nation. With such players as Kenny Washington, Jimmy Nelson, Jack Nelson, Bob Hoffman, Bill Fisk and others of that caliber on the squad, the Bears are truly a team of major league rating.

Today's contest climaxes a most successful season for the Hollywood Bears. The Bears, backed by Signal Oil Company executives, and with crafty Paul Schissler, coach of note, at the helm, began the season from scratch. The Bears hurdled many obstacles, gained enthusiastic followers as the season progressed, and came down the homestretch in second place as the campaign neared the finish.

The Bears opposed the Oakland Giants, Pacific Coast League leaders, on December 30th, and overwhelmed them 48 to 0. This win placed Hollywood in first place, a position which the Bears held at the close of the season.

The Bears are therefore placing their championship record on the block today, and the Service All-Stars will attempt to blast it.

The Hollywood Bears-Service All-Stars football game didn't "just happen." There was much preliminary thought and work in connection with the big football classic.

Today's pigskin duel is not a Hollywood Bears promotion. To the contrary, the Bears are merely one of two teams which were invited to contest in a Sister Kenny Foundation "bowl" game, as it were. The Service All-Stars were likewise invited to play. Both, of course, were glad to field their strong teams for the benefit of the Sister Kenny Foundation, and accepted invitations.

The Hollywood Bears-Service All-Stars football classic was not staged as a "benefit," however. The contest, which promises to be the greatest pigskin attraction of the season, was staged on its merit.

Following today's game a substantial contribution from the receipts will be contributed to the Sister Kenny Foundation by the Hollywood Bears Football Club and the members of the Service All-Stars football team.

The American Legion, Los Angeles County Council, will also share in the receipts of today's game.

The Hollywood Bears Football Club has not only striven to present the finest professional football possible for local football fans this year, but it made a determined effort to serve the community as well. In this connection, the Hollywood Bears have had hundreds of convalescent Service Men as their guests at games this year, and have likewise had hundreds of youngsters as guests. The Bears have also aided in Sister Kenny Foundation, and American Legion fund activities.

The Service All-Star eleven which will face the Hollywood Bears today is composed chiefly of the outstanding stars who have competed for the El Toro Marines and Fleet City during the past season. The El Toro, and Fleet City grid records for the past season, as well as that of the Hollywood Bears, follows:



He is the 'hottest copy' in football today and most certainly the fastest thing in gridiron togs.




