LAST YEAR'S TOURNAMENT WON BY NEW CUMBERLAND GENERAL DEPOT

This year Carlisle Barracks and Stark Field will be the scene of the Annual Second Army Baseball Play-offs for the third time.

Last year's tournament was won by New Cumberland General Depot, Pa., but only after a close finish against Fort Knox, Ky.

The first day's action saw Fort Knox, New Cumberland, Fort Eustis and Carlisle Barracks post wins over 2272 Escort Det., Philadelphia, Fort, Monroe, Fort Hayes and Aberdeen Proving Grounds.

The second day's play brought about the elimination of Fort Monroe and Fort Hayes. The Escort Detachment eliminated Monroe while Aberdeen dropped Fort Hayes out of further play. On the second day, Fort Eustis handed Carlisle Barracks a 15-4 shellacking and New Cumberland won over Fort Knox 1-0.

August 27, saw Carlisle Barracks lose to Fort Knox 9-4 and Aberdeen dropped the 2272 ASU out of the tournament by a 10-5 score. New Cumberland won their third straight victory, handing Fort Eustis their first loss by a closely played 5-3 game.

New Cumberland and Fort Knox were the opposing teams in the final game of the 1948 play-offs with New Cumberland edging the Knox team by a 4-3 margin.

History of Carlisle Barracks

Carlisle Barracks, established in 1757 by the British, is one of the oldest and most historic military installations in the U. S.

It has served as a frontier post during the French and Indian Wars, a munitions depot during the Revolution and the War of 1812 and as a supply depot during the War Between the States. In this latter war it was briefly occupied by Confederate troops who burned many of its buildings.

Carlisle Barracks' greatest past fame came during the days when it was the home of the Carlisle Indian Industrial School from 1875 until 1918. This school became world famous for great athletic teams it produced in all sports, especially football, and for having produced some of America's outstanding athletes such as Jim Thorpe, Chief Bender and Tewamia. Glenn S. "Pop" Warner started his brilliant coaching career here with the Indian team.

At the end of World War I the post became briefly a General Hospital and then the home of the Medical Field Service School until 1946. Then it was occupied by the Army Information School (now the Armed Forces Information School since unification) and subsequently by several other schools, two of which still function here, The Chaplain School and The Army Security Agency School.

The oldest building on the post, built in 1777, is the Hessian Guardhouse which is now a military museum. It is open to visitors each Wednesday and Sunday from 1 to 5 PM.
